A few points to get you started.

- You will be assigned a mentor.
- Always carry a set of waterproofs and an umbrella.
- You will need to arrive at least 1 hour before inspection or assembly time.
- During your training you are not usually awarded expenses and you will have to travel sometimes for  $1\frac{1}{2}$  to 2 hours to get to the venue.
- Once qualified you will be awarded travelling expenses and hotel fees if you have an overnight stay. Sometimes you get lunch and sometimes you don't, therefore always check before you go.
- After qualifying as a County Judge it is worth asking Lincolnshire County Archery and EMAS if a grant is available to help with buying equipment. As a rough guide it will cost you around £300 for the equipment and clothing you need.
- Once qualified as long as you Judge at 6 shoots in a season you will be awarded £100 from EMAS.

Here are a few basic things you will need to do during your first year.

- Complete form J00 and forward to the Regional JLO (Judge Liaison Officer)
- Be a minimum age of 18
- Have a good knowledge of AGB Rules of Shooting and have a basic knowledge of the WA Rules.
- Have had experience in assisting higher qualified judges for a minimum of 12 judging days at tournaments.
- Shoots attended will include a minimum of 1 event from each discipline (Target, Field and Indoor)
- Attended at least 1 Regional or National Judge Conference.
- Have attended the Candidate Judge Seminar.

When you have completed the above and feel you are ready you will fill in another form and your JLO will arrange an assessment at an outdoor or indoor tournament. You will also sit an exam about what you have learned throughout your training.
